A Message From Our CEO

2020 has been an incredibly challenging year for everyone that I know. From personal losses to job challenges to health concerns and everything in between, everyone seems to be struggling. Add in the stress and strain of COVID-19, and we are all worrying more than ever.

Worry and stress are compounded even further when caring for a loved one who is seriously or terminally ill. People ask themselves: "Am I doing everything that I can to take good care of this very important person? What do I do about COVID-19? How can I avoid getting sick so I can be sure to be able to provide the TLC that my loved one truly deserves? Should I connect with Hospice now - during the pandemic?"

At Hospice of Orleans, Inc., we are here to support you and those you love as you balance all of these very real concerns. Our commitment to safe, high quality care has been unwavering. With an abundance of caution, we have taken very strict precautions to ensure the health and safety of those people who have been entrusted to our care as well as our staff and volunteers.

I'd like to share a bit about the steps we have taken to keep everyone safe.

Visiting has changed at the Martin-Linsin Residence. Visiting hours are now limited to Noon to 4:00 pm, and only two visitors per patient are allowed in the Residence at any time. All visitors are screened, and guests must wear a mask, use hand sanitizer and practice social distancing. Our staff is happy to help arrange a virtual visit via FaceTime, Zoom, Webex or another program so that you and your loved one can see and visit with one another. Anyone visiting from outside of New York State is required to quarantine in NY for 14 days prior to visiting.

All staff are screened daily, must wear a mask, use hand sanitizer, wash their hands frequently, and practice social distancing. Staff have received extensive training and reminders of NYSDOH requirements and CDC guidelines.

Any staff member leaving NYS for vacation is required to be quarantined for 14 days upon return. The same is true when a staff member has a guest or family member who has visited outside of NYS.

Prior to admission, all patients are screened for the virus. Patients and caregivers are educated on COVID-19 signs and symptoms, as well as prevention measures.

We have suspended our massage, music and pet therapy programs as well as the use of our amazing volunteers during this challenging time. We have also suspended face to face visits for our Supportive Care and Transitions programs.

Routine cleaning and sanitizing has been enhanced, and we have increased our efforts to ensure frequently touched surfaces are regularly disinfected.

Pandemic, COVID-19, masking, and social distancing are not terms that were readily in our vocabulary prior to 2020, and they are not things that any of us would have ever imagined that we would have to cope with. All of this has created special challenges for those whose loved ones are dying or who have passed during this time whether they have been served by Hospice or not. The normal practices and rituals associated with death and dying have been very difficult, and often impossible, to complete during the pandemic. Gathering at the bedside of a loved one who is in their final days or weeks has been extremely challenging. Supporting the caregiver with meals or offering to provide a bit of respite to the family has been enormously difficult. Not to mention when the person passes, being unable to properly celebrate and recognize the loved one with visits to their home, calling hours, wake, funeral service, burial, and a communal meal celebrating everything good and special about the person who passed together. Grief and loss are compounded when they cannot be shared with others who loved the deceased.

At Hospice of Orleans, we recognize these challenges, and we are here for you. While we are still not holding our in-person Caregiver or Grief Support Groups, we are here for you via telephone or video call. Our FREE support services are open to anyone in the community regardless of whether you are receiving services through the organization or not. Once things settle down a bit more with COVID-19, and it is safe to do so, we will begin to open up our Counseling and Conference Center for support group meetings. In the meantime, I highly encourage you to call our office at 585-589-0809 to schedule a telephone or video call with one of our highly skilled staff.

Hospice is here to provide you with compassionate, non-judgmental support as you help your loved one with their serious illness or end of life journey. You are important, and your worries, sadness, frustrations, and concerns should not be ignored. We can help you cope. Please call us today.

Many thanks to our community for your continued support during this global crisis. Your generous gifts have helped to sustain us during this most difficult time. Whether you contributed a financial gift, sent recognition gifts for our staff, donated masks or other personal protective equipment, or kept us in your thoughts, YOU ARE APPRECIATED! Grief and Loss

Many people are experiencing grief during the COVID-19 pandemic. Grief is a normal response to loss during or after a disaster or other traumatic event. Grief can happen in response to loss of life, as well as to drastic changes to daily routines and ways of life that usually bring us comfort and a feeling of stability. Common grief reactions include:

- · Shock, disbelief, or denial
- Anxiety
- Distress
- Anger
- Periods of sadness
- Loss of sleep and loss of appetite

Some people may experience multiple losses during a disaster or large-scale emergency event. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, you might be unable to be with a loved one when they die, or unable to mourn someone's death in-person with friends and family. Other types of loss include unemployment, reduced income, loss or reduction in support services, and other changes in your lifestyle. These losses can happen at the same time, which can complicate or prolong grief and delay a person's ability to adapt, heal, and recover.

If you have lost a loved one during the COVID-19 pandemic:

Grieving the loss of a loved one while coping with the fear and anxiety related to the COVID-19 pandemic can be especially overwhelming. Social distancing, "stay-at home-orders," and limits on the size of in-person gatherings have changed the way friends and family can gather and grieve, including holding traditional funeral services, regardless of whether or not the person's death was due to COVID-19. However, these types of prevention strategies are important to slow the spread of COVID-19.

Some things you can do to help you cope with feelings of grief after the loss of a loved include:

Connecting with other people

- Invite people to call you or host conference calls with family members and friends to stay connected.
- Ask family and friends to share stories and pictures with you via mailed letters, email, phone, or video chat or via apps or social media that allow groups to share with each other (e.g., group chat, group messaging, Facebook).
- Coordinate a date and time for family and friends to honor your loved one by reciting a selected poem, spiritual reading, or prayer within their own households.

Creating memories or rituals.

- Develop a virtual memory book, blog, or webpage to remember your loved one, and ask family and friends to contribute their memories and stories.
- Take part in an activity, such as planting a tree or preparing a favorite meal that has significance to you and the loved one who died.

Asking for help from others

- Seek out grief counseling or mental health services, support groups, or hotlines, especially those that can be offered over the phone or online.
- Seek spiritual support from faith-based organizations, including your religious leaders and congregations, if applicable.
- Seek support from other trusted community leaders and friends.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the family and close friends of a person who died of COVID-19 may experience stigma, such as social avoidance or rejection. Stigma hurts everyone by creating fear or anger towards other people. Some people may avoid contacting you, your family members, and friends when they would normally reach out to you. Stigma related to COVID-19 is less likely to occur when

people know the facts and share them with extended family, friends, and others in your community.

If you feel distress from other types of loss or change:

During the COVID-19 pandemic, you may feel grief due to loss of a job; inability to connect in-person with friends, family or religious organizations; missing special events and milestones (such as graduations, weddings, vacations); and experiencing drastic changes to daily routines and ways of life that bring comfort. You may also feel a sense of guilt for grieving over losses that seem less important than loss of life. Grief is a universal emotion; there is no right or wrong way to experience it, and all losses are significant.

Here are some ways to cope with feelings of grief:

Acknowledge your losses and your feelings

- Find ways to express your grief. Some people express grief and find comfort through art, gardening, writing, talking to friends or family, cooking, music, or other creative practices.
- Consider developing new rituals in your daily routine to stay connected with your loved ones to replace those that have been lost.
- People who live together may consider playing board games and exercising together outdoors.
- People who live alone or are separated from their loved ones may consider interacting through phone calls and apps that allow for playing games together virtually.
- If you are worried about future losses, try to stay in the present and focus on aspects of your life that you have control over right now.

Connecting Patients to Hospice Care, Through Technology

COVID-19 has changed the way Hospice of Orleans provides its caring hospice services to patients and their families. To ensure that we can continue to provide the level of consistent care in the safest manner, we've incorporated and expanded the use of telehealth as per CMS quidelines.

Telehealth, or telemedicine, is the exchange of medical information from one location to another using electronic communication. It allows healthcare professionals to evaluate, diagnose, and treat patients in remote locations using telecommunications technology. This technology can include remote patient monitoring, telephone calls, and two-way audiovideo technology that allows for real-time interaction between the clinician and patient, such as Facetime, Skype, and mobile apps.

Telehealth use has surged over the past several years, as the general population, including older adults, has become more comfortable with the use of technology in their daily lives. COVID-19

has made telehealth more than just an option for provider and patient convenience; faced with the risk of spreading the virus, providers have moved to telehealth to keep patients and providers safely distanced.

Hospice of Orleans uses telehealth to improve patient experience, and aid in the health and safety of patients, their loved ones and our staff. Some of the telehealth benefits realized include:

- Improved access to care
- Reduced cost of providing care
- Reduced or eliminated travel time
- Improved clinical outcomes
- Increased patient and family satisfaction

While in person, face to face care is our preferred way to help our patients, when this is not possible our Hospice professionals meet patient and family needs for emotional support, mental health care, and connection to bereavement services as well, delivering a full spectrum of care to our community through video conferencing.
